

1,2 & 3 John
Study by Joy of Living (11-week study)

The books of 1, 2, and 3 John are letters written by the Apostle John, who also wrote the Gospel of John. In these three letters, John addresses many truths that are critical to our walk with the Lord. What he has to say within these letters can make the difference...between walking, that is living, in condemnation or walking in forgiveness and freedom; between being deceived or knowing the truth; between having the assurance of salvation or living in the fear of death. John helps the believer understand what it truly means to live and walk in fellowship with the Lord.

Remember your joy: a Bible study of salvation stories from the Old Testament

This seven-week Bible study, with an emphasis on biblical theology, traces the promised seed of the woman from Genesis 3:15 through seven Old Testament stories. Each chapter—Noah and the ark, Abraham and Isaac, Moses with the manna and water from the rock, the serpent on the pole, Rahab and the spies, David and Goliath, and David and Mephibosheth—gives us a glimpse, a foreshadowing, of the greater salvation Jesus wins. In each encounter, we'll see how God faithfully fulfilled his promise as he prepared us for the ultimate offspring who brought our eternal salvation. Each story will be accompanied by a symbol that represents an aspect of our salvation. These symbols are intended to be visual reminders of spiritual truths. David once wrote: "Restore to me the joy of your salvation" (Ps. 51:12). Our hope is that you will remember the joy of your salvation—and praise the One who accomplished it—as you consider the battle he won on your behalf.

God of Covenant
Study by Jen Wilkin (10-week study)

Following the study of God of Creation, Jen Wilkins begins in Genesis 12 and walks through the stories of the fathers of our faith. We discover how God is working everything together for His glory and for the good of His people. Through these chapters in Genesis, we witness imager bearers who sin and wrestle to maintain trust in the only One who will fulfil every promise, the One for whom nothing is too hard. In every page, we learn to see Jesus through the stories of His people and discover how the God of creation and covenant is the same yesterday, today and forever.
